INTRODUCTION

UWH REFEREE STANDARDS - OVERVIEW

This document is designed to provide an overview of Underwater Hockey Refereeing structure in terms of referee categories and associated courses.

It provides an overview for standards for each UWH Referee Levels and which types of events each of these levels can officiate at.

Further guidance is provided in the additional information section.

UWH REFEREE COURSES

The following courses are sanctioned by the CMAS UWH Referee Commission.

1.1 Referee Level 1

1.1.1 Rules

- Overview of game and procedures (National Federation level)
- Role and responsibilities of officials and referees.
- Playing area, player equipment, team composition
- Basic rules, puck placement
- Basic infringements, referees signs and corresponding actions.

1.1.2 Referee

To meet the standard of a Level 1 Referee*

- Referee code of conduct / ethical
- Referee clear communication (water referees, chief referee, timekeeper/scorer).
- Timekeeping accuracy, correct scoring.
- Basic referee positioning.
- Level 1 fitness tests

1.2 Referee Level 2

1.2.1 Rules

- Overview of CMAS UWH structure and events
- Competition organization process, overview of CMAS Procedures and Obligations (P&O).
- Understanding and advanced interpretation of rules.
- Enhanced analysis of infringements
- Protests and appeals

1.2.2 Referee

To meet the standard of a Level 2 Referee*

- Referee clear communication (referees, players, officials, public)
- Enhanced referee positioning / moving with play.
- Game management (before, during and after)
- Level 2 fitness tests

1.3 Referee Level 3

1.3.1 Proof of experience validation

To meet the standard of a Level 3 Referee *

- Peers validation of experience (game management, judgment quality, communication)
- Level 3 fitness tests

UWH REFEREE ACTIVE STATUS


The standards set out the criteria to achieve the respective standard, however in order for a Referee to maintain this standard they must remain "active".

The following sets out the criteria to maintain an "Active" status of an UWH Referee:

HOW TO MAINTAIN ACTIVE STATUS	Validate a refereeing experience on the last 4 years cycle*, during club and regional events (logbook). Recommendations:	Validate a refereeing experience on the last 4 years cycle*, during national events or category B and C events (logbook). Recommendations:	Required to be an active Level 2 referee. Validate a high-level refereeing experience during the last 2 years by refereeing the 1st national divisions or category B or C events. High-level referee skills are under approval of NF Referee Director or delegate. Passing the current Level 3 fitness criteria during the current season. Approval of NF Referee Director or delegate.
RECLASSIFIED AS ACTIVE	If a referee does not fulfill the above conditions, he becomes inactive (but keep Level 1 certificate). He can only referee under the supervision of a level 1 or higher referee. To become active again, he must participate in a refresher course. This refresher course includes several game sessions under the supervision of a level 2 or higher referee, completed by oral tests and / or theoretical discussions, in particular the latest rules evolutions.	If a referee does not fulfill the above conditions, he becomes inactive (but keep Level 2 certificate). He can only referee under the supervision of a level 2 or higher referee. To become active again, he must participate in a refresher course. This refresher course includes several game sessions under the supervision of a level 2 or higher referee, completed by oral tests and / or theoretical discussions, in particular the latest rules evolutions.	If a Level 3 referee does not fulfill the above conditions, he becomes Level 3 inactive (but could remain active Level 2). To become active Level 3 again, the referee shall fulfill the active criteria and receive approval of NF Referee Director.

^{*:} A 4 years cycle corresponds to a World Championship cycle and authorizes a break for personal or medical reasons.

**: Refereeing experience can also be acquired during referee training and national team training.
